KEY POINTS

Clear rules for party registration and oversight.

Fair hearings and court appeals guaranteed.



Democracy works best when parties represent people. The new amendment demands accountability from our political parties.

30 Percent Women. A Fairer Sierra Leone.



KEY POINTS

Minimum 30% women candidates.

Applies to national and local elections.

Opens doors to fair representation.

What's in the New Constitution



Fair Representation in Parliament.



Under President Maada Bio, parliamentary seats will reflect population and fairness, not politics.

KEY POINTS

District block representation.

Census-based seat allocation.

Clear rules to prevent last-minute manipulation.



The new constitution ensures every district gets fair representation. Support fair representation reforms.

What's in the New Constitution



Winning Must Reflect the Whole Nation.



Under the amendment, the President must win broad national support, not just numbers.

KEY POINTS

Simple majority plus nationwide spread.

Independent candidates allowed.

Clear run-off timelines.

Fixed election date every five years.



Let's protect our national unity through fair elections.

Peaceful Transitions Protect Stability And Democracy.



The new amendment strengthens orderly transfers of power in Sierra Leone.

KEY POINTS

No major appointments after elections.

No major contracts or institutional changes.

Clear limits on emergency powers.

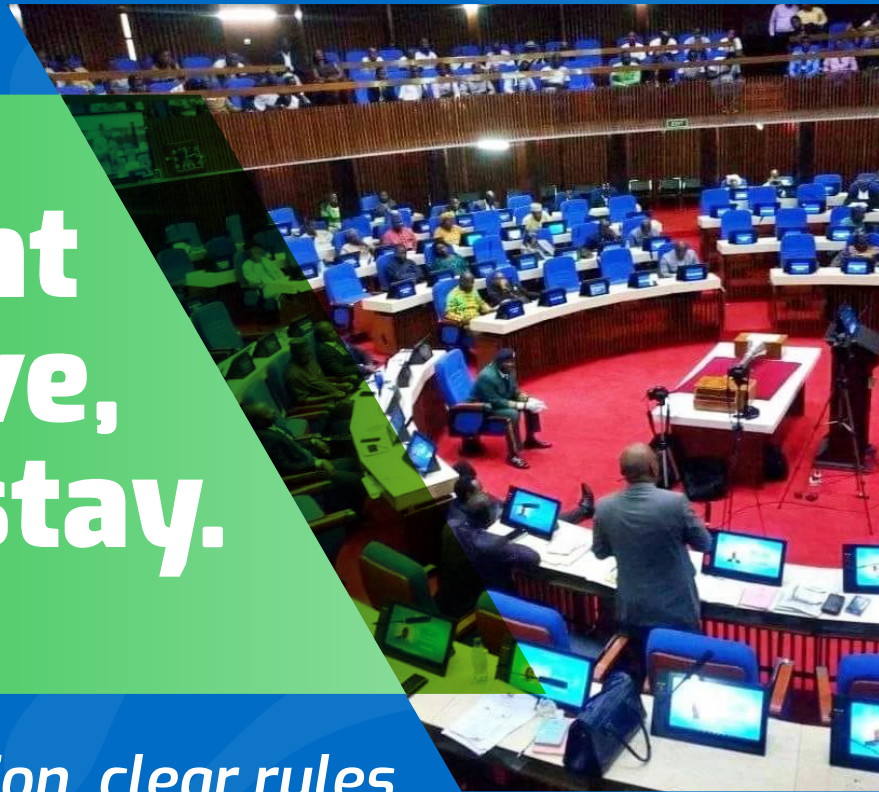


Outgoing presidents will no longer tie the hands of the next government.

In the new constitution, clear rules safeguard Parliament's integrity.

KEY POINTS

Fixed five-year parliamentary term.

Strong disqualification rules for serious crimes.

Public officers must resign before contesting.

WHY IT MATTERS Public office is a trust, not a lifetime entitlement.



Support accountability in Parliament.
